

## **“Station Fire” Update (as of August 28, 2009, 12:00 a.m.)**

- The “Station Fire” started at approximately 4:00 p.m. on August 26, 2009
- The location is near Mile Marker 29 on Angeles Crest Highway in the Angeles National Forest (approximately 5 miles from LCF)
- Approximately 300 acres burned
- The fire continues to burn to the northwest towards Big Tujunga Canyon (near the ridge of Mt. Lukens Truck Trail)
- Another fire along Angeles Crest Highway, near the Angeles Crest Ranger Station is burning southeast
- A voluntary evacuation order has been issued to the area from La Canada Blvd on the west, Vista Del Valle on the south, Angeles Crest Highway on the south, Starlight Crest Drive on the south, Greenridge Dr. on the east, and all this area to the north; a reverse 911 message has been send to residents in this area; the evacuation location is La Canada High School
- The Pasadena Humane Society is available at La Canada High School for pet care/shelter
- Heed directions from deputies and fire personnel in your neighborhood
- No structures are burning or immediately threatened
- There is no imminent threat to the community unless winds shift significantly (not anticipate by LA County Fire)
- Water drops over brush will end at nightfall, however will resume to protect structures
- Review your individual preparedness plans and continue to monitor local news and this website for updates
- The City will continue to notify residents via its reverse 911 system with critical public safety information
