

“Station Fire” Update

(as of August 28, 2009, 2:00 p.m.)

- The “Station Fire” started at approximately 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, August 26, 2009
- Approximately **1,500** acres have burned
- The western fire continues to burn to the northwest towards Big Tujunga Canyon (near the ridge of Mt. Lukens Truck Trail)
- The eastern fire along Angeles Crest Highway, near the Angeles Crest Ranger Station is burning southeast along the ridgeline and is also north of Greenridge Drive and Starlight Crest
- The voluntary evacuation remains in place for the area that was called yesterday evening with no plans for a mandatory evacuation at this time
- *Residents still in this area should be packed and ready to leave if a mandatory evacuation order is issued later today; La Cañada High School has been set up as the evacuation center*
- Significant water drops are currently defending homes from Angeles Crest Highway to La Cañada Blvd.
- Strike teams are also at the ready in these neighborhoods
- The Pasadena Humane Society is available at La Canada High School for pet care/shelter
- Heed directions from deputies and fire personnel in your neighborhood
- Approximately 5% containment
- Fire officials are closely monitoring any possible wind shifts, especially this afternoon
- Review your individual preparedness plan and continue to monitor local news and this website for updates
- The City will continue to notify residents via its reverse 911 system with critical public safety information
